

# 2007 OHF Organizational Grants

## **Bridgewater Village School**

To provide partial funding for purchase of an automated external defibrillator (AED). \$1,600

## **Good Neighbor Health Clinic**

To cover half the cost of providing medical and dental care to low-income uninsured residents in the OHF service area. \$12,100

## **Green Mountain Horse Association**

To provide partial funding for purchase of an automated external defibrillator (AED). \$1,600

## **Hartland Community Connections / Planned Parenthood of Northeastern New England**

To fund project to promote communication about healthy sexuality and relationships for teens through program with parents of middle school children. \$3,933

## **Hartland Elementary School**

To fund purchase of materials and support to K-2 class teachers to help children with sensory integration dysfunction, with Woodstock Learning Trust. \$800

## **Hartland Public Library**

To provide for an automated external defibrillator (AED) for the library and adjacent sports fields and to provide for health-related library materials. \$3,270

## **Health Coverage Fellowship/Blue Cross Blue Shield of Massachusetts Foundation**

To support funding of a Vermont journalist to attend the 2007 health coverage fellowship training—Vermont Fellow is Kevin O'Connor of the Rutland Herald. \$1,000

## **Kingdom County Productions**

Upon completion of film version of The Voices Project, to fund three local screenings and distribution of copies of film to local schools and libraries. \$1,500

## **Mt. Ascutney Hospital & Health Center**

Second of a three-year grant to support the transition of provider to operate the Ottauquechee Health Center. \$75,000

## **North Universalist Chapel Society**

To provide funds for an interfaith presentation on hospice to recruit community hospice volunteers. \$295

## **Ottawaquechee Community Partnership**

To fund prevention educational materials for families and training costs. \$2,174

## **Our Lady of the Snows Catholic Church**

To provide partial funding for purchase of an automated external defibrillator (AED). \$1,000

## **Reinventing Health**

To work with the Hartland Elementary School to continue to record body mass index of students and to use data to determine need for prevention programs to avoid obesity that may lead to life-long risk of diabetes and other chronic disease. \$2,300

## **Spectrum Teen Center**

To support teen center's contribution to healthy community through substance abuse prevention and promotion of healthy behaviors. \$1,000

**Upper Valley Trails Alliance**

To encourage active living skill development through a passport to winter fun program promoting winter outdoor sports for elementary school children in area schools. \$10,700

**Vermont Campaign to End Childhood Hunger**

To provide "Cooking for Life" nutrition education classes to youth and adults in our service area aimed at low income Vermonters at risk of being hungry. \$7,000

**Vermont Children's Aid Society**

To provide comprehensive child and family counseling, pregnancy and maternal support services. \$16,000

**Vermont Technical College**

Continues educational grants for health care training to service-area residents who will provide health care to area residents. \$15,000

**Visiting Nurse Association & Hospice of VT&NH**

Continue telemedicine program for those currently enrolled in special telemedicine project funded by the Foundation to provide needed telephone monitoring of those in need but not covered by government funded program. \$4,000

**Volunteers in Action**

To coordinate volunteers providing transportation to medical appointments and provide other health support in Hartland, Reading and Quechee. \$1,200

**Windsor Central Supervisory Union**

To provide funds for oral health education and screening to district elementary school students. \$9,138

**Woodstock Ambulance**

To fund first response equipment for new first responder members. \$2,048

**Woodstock Area Council on Aging/Thompson Senior Center**

To provide local matching funds for the purchase of a van to transport seniors to medical appointments, grocery shopping and to prevent isolation, allowing seniors to remain at home. \$4,700

**Woodstock Union High School**

To fund the implementation of restorative justice program at Woodstock Union High School. \$2,000
